Comprehension of Information - Interpreting Texts

Contextual Summary

This is an English reading task that enables students to practise their reading and comprehension skills. The task links to specific information about the history of the Isle of Wight Steam Railway, and of the Isle of Wight generally, that should be interesting and relevant to students in lower key stage 2.

Questions have been chosen because they enable students to practise their comprehension and interpretation of unseen texts, focusing on the understanding and retrieval of information.

The task could be useful in preparing students for visiting the Isle of Wight Steam Railway museum, as they will then have an insight into some of the historical aspects of the railway.

Essentially, this task links with the visit in a supporting, peripheral sense, allowing for the key skills of English to be practised whilst engaging with the aspects of the Isle of Wight Steam Railway.

Ability Levels

There is one version of this resource for lower key stage 2, generally adapted for low/mid/high ability students. These could be adapted further by teachers if required, i.e. for SEN. For example, students could be tasked with answering fewer questions, or the ones that interest them the most, or perhaps work in teams to find the answers.

Key skills practised in this unit:

- ▶ Reading for understanding and information
- ▶ Interpretation skills
- ▶ Showing an understanding of form, purpose, & audience

The above skills are required to be taught and practised as per the National Curriculum, for lower key stage 2, READING - COMPREHENSION, and the Scottish Curriculum for Excellence.
