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Between the distant signal and Hyde Bridge speed to be reduced to 15 miles per hour, which must be brought down to 10 on entering station.

Between the Sandown distant and home signals the speed not to exceed 15 miles per hour,

All other crossing stations to be approached with caution.

On no part of the Railway between Ryde St. John's Road and Ventnor on either up or down journey, under any circumstances, must the speed exceed 40 miles per hour, either with Passenger or Goods trains or Light Engines, and between Ryde Pier Head and Esplanade the speed not to exceed 20 miles per hour.

Terminal Stations to be entered at such a speed that trains can be brought to a stand by hand brake.
