Working With Others: Teamwork (Treasure Hunt)

Contextual Summary

This is an engaging treasure hunt style resource that challenges students to investigate and discover facts and information about the Isle of Wight Donkey Sanctuary, their donkeys, the donkeys' lives and characteristics, etc. This mixed ability resource is designed ideally for students of various abilities to work as part of a pair or team, moving around the Sanctuary to find the required information by reading, listening or asking questions. Worksheets could be completed independently if required by the teacher.

There are elements of English crossover due to the reading/literacy/

listening skills required. The task links specifically to the sanctuary environment, although it could be adapted to other environments and key stages.

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Task Implementation

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This is an on-site resource that is designed to be completed whilst students are visiting the Sanctuary. It is perhaps best used at the end of their visit so they can demonstrate their understanding of what they have seen and heard. The task is designed so that students are able to complete the challenge in pairs of groups. Minimal teacher supervision is required.

The treasure hunt is designed to be a fun activity allowing students to explore the Sanctuary to find the answers, working together, using their reading, listening and investigative skills.

Ability Levels

There are three variants of this resource, one each for mixed ability students in key stages 2L, 2U and 3. Teachers can support students in their undertaking of the challenge as necessary for ability.

Key skills practised in this unit:

- ▶ Working together
- ▶ Asking questions / finding information
- ▶ Literacy skills (reading and listening)
- ▶ Synthesising information.

Relationship to Curriculum

The above skills are required to be taught and practised as per the National Curriculum, and the guidance of the PSHE Association, for key stage 2 and key stage 3.
