INTRO

Your task is to write an informative entry for a travel guide, which features the highlights of a day at Robin Hill Country Park.



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Audience: tourists / potential visitors www.edudest.uk

Language: use a mix of formal and informal language.

- Use personal pronouns to relate to your audience.
- Control the use of tenses using past, present, future, imperative and auxiliary verb forms: can, would, could, should, might, may.
- Use carefully selected vocabulary for effect, including adjectives and adverbs that relay your point of view.
- Use a variety of connectives and adverbials to link sentences and paragraphs using subordinate clauses.

Layout/Structure: the text should have a clear structure and be written in a narrative form. You may feel that an illustration or photographs would enhance the entry.

- Start in an engaging way to captivate the reader
- Consider including details of location and how to get there.
- You could use sub headings to itemise the different areas.
- Consider all types of tourists when giving examples.
- Emphasise the positive aspects, but be honest.
